## College Overview

# SEDA College (SA) is an independent senior secondary school (Years 11 and 12 only) registered as a not-for-profit organisation.

The College is unique in its education model, which incorporates a satellite and hub structure. This structure ensures that the learning venues are situated within top-notch sporting facilities in the community. Currently, the College boasts a total of 9 venues, catering to 5 different sports. These venues are in partnership with esteemed sporting organisations in South Australia, namely the Adelaide Crows FC, South Australian Cricket Association and Adelaide Strikers, Netball SA and Adelaide Thunderbirds, Basketball SA, Adelaide Lightning and the Adelaide 36ers as well as Adelaide United and Football SA.

Since its establishment as an independent school in July 2018, the College has been a proud member of the Association of Independent Schools South Australia (AISSA). It officially commenced student enrolments in January 2019.

Through the integration of sport, the College delivers a comprehensive curriculum, including the South Australia Certificate of Education (SACE), Vocational and Education Training (VET), as well as School-based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SBATs).

Our approach focuses on providing real-world learning opportunities that align with specific roles within the sports industry. This is coupled with a Project-based Learning approach, which is at the core of our delivery methodology. We firmly believe that this approach effectively engages young individuals and caters to their personal development needs

Using hands-on activities, the College focuses upon the development of key work skills and habits, which are embedded in every component of learning delivered at the College and prepare young people for the next phase of their life.

# Strategic Planning

The College is continuing to work through its initial long-term plan aptly named 'Securing the Future'.

The main objectives of the plan are in place to enable the College to achieve its Mission Statement at a high level by the end of 2024.

- Objective 1
  Strong culture and strong outcomes for young people
- Objective 2
  Financial stability that secures the College's future
- Objective 3
  Strong structures and systems that underpin practice and sustainable growth
- Objective 4
  High level capabilities across all staff so they can undertake their role/s with excellence

The College is on a strong growth trajectory. By the start of 2023, the College anticipates enrolments will be approximately 200 students with demand for places at a premium. This represents a 7-fold increase from the initial intake of 2019. The College does not anticipate any addition to the sports available for the sport development programs offered, but will see the offering of high-performance options and an expansion of its geographical reach, so that the unique program offered will be accessible to a far greater number.

Accompanying staff growth to support applied students-centred learning, will see an increase in staff employed to approximately 35 staff members across both teaching and non-teaching roles. This will be supported by an increase in specific leadership positions to support and develop staff to deliver the very best version of the SEDA model in South Australia.


